The Royal Berkshire NHS Foundation Trust is committed to recognising the valuable role of Carers and working with them as partners to deliver excellent patient care.

A Carer is anyone, including children and adults, who looks after a family member, partner or friend who needs help because of their illness, frailty, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction and cannot cope without their support. The care they give is unpaid.

Our Carers' Charter is based on our Trust CARE values and outlines what you can expect from us and how you can help us.

What you can expect from us:

- Carers' will be identified as early as possible and you will be central to the care planning and delivery of care for the person you are supporting (with their consent).
- Acknowledgement of the vital contribution and lived experience of Carers. We will ensure you are aware of your rights to a Carers Assessment.
- Respect and recognise the knowledge you have gained about the person you care for. Reassurance that we will care for your loved one as you would expect us to.
- Ensure you are aware of support available to you locally by signposting and sharing information relevant to your Carer needs.

What we would like from you:

- Complete a Carer feedback survey so we can learn from your experience and make improvements if necessary.
- A Always speak to us if you have any concerns. You can arrange an appointment to speak with a specific member of staff, but there will always be a member of staff available to listen.
- Recognise the pressures our staff are working under to deliver excellent care to every patient, and show them respect, even if you are feeling under a lot of stress.
- Ensure you tell us if you need additional support in your role as a Carer; we can offer help and support to you too.
