"Aisha introduced FAST packs to colleagues who needed it during Ramadan which included water, energy bars, dates and recipe cards. She also created information leaflets and guidance, as well as Ally badges for staff wanting to support their colleagues. Alongside this she also co-led the set up of the Women's + Network, and runs the Inclusion section in the Trust induction."

COMMUNITY LIVER HEALTH CHECKS

"In just over a year, the team have carried out 3000 scans in the community to detect early signs of liver disease and liver cancer. They have been able to tackle health inequalities and stigma around liver disease. reaching out into locations including soup kitchens and food banks, sexual health clinics, and GP surgeries, as well as offering home visits for particularly vulnerable people."

And, as part of the MDT have been involved in projects including: the Phagenyx work with the Acute Stroke Unit and Speech and Language Therapy team."

OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO RESEARCH



ANGELIKA KRISTEK

"Angelika has shown exceptional initiative by designing, establishing, and leading a new Clinical Research Workshop at the Trust. Recognising the need, she took proactive steps to create a programme to support and empower new researchers, with 70% of attendees rating the workshop as excellent. Her efforts not only enhance research capability within the Trust, but also inspire staff to pursue high-quality, impactful studies."

BALAJI SURANARAYANAN, PAEDIATRICS

"Balaji is one of our main consultant leads and has been involved in research for many years. He shows enthusiasm, commitment and engagement to any study he is involved in, and is a voice of reason and reassurance, for the research team and parents of participants alike. He is a wonderful advocate for the research we do, and recently, successfully lead the team during the HARMONIE trial, which saw our site recruiting the most patients in the region."





CARDIOLOGY RESEARCH TEAM

"The team have developed a simple scoring system which could revolutionise how we prevent heart attacks and strokes by identifying patients most likely to benefit from preventive medications. The breakthrough test, called the TRIPLE Score, measures specific proteins on blood platelets along with the patient's age to help doctors make more informed decisions about prescribing blood-thinning medications such as aspirin."

DERMATOLOGY RESEARCH TEAM

"Within the last year or so, the team have gone from strength to strength and now have a portfolio of studies on the go. They have six non-commercial studies actively recruiting or having been given the green light, and three active commercial studies, with two more in the pipeline. Alongside patient benefits, the commercial studies have positive financial benefits, allowing the research within the department to expand due to funding more research nurse time."





RENAL RESEARCH TEAM

"The team embodies excellence in renal research, seamlessly integrating scientific discovery with real-world patient benefits. Through high-impact publications, pioneering clinical trials, and groundbreaking innovations, they are transforming kidney care and reinforcing our center as a hub of excellence. In 2024 alone they contributed to 12 publications, and initiated five new commercial studies, with the Trust chosen as 'lead site' for one."

OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO SAFETY



AMU / SSU PATIENT FLOW TEAM

"With their extensive knowledge, teamwork, and strong work ethic, they make sure patients are discharged safely and smoothly. By collaborating with the multidisciplinary team, discharges are well-coordinated, with care, medications, and transport in place. They are also the top users of the Trust's Discharge Lounge, and their dedication and hard work make them a critical component of the hospital's daily operations and the overall patient experience."

BREAST CANCER OPEN ACCESS FOLLOW-UP

"Catherine, Paulina, and Anna run the Trust's Breast Cancer Open Access Follow-Up system, which moves on-going patient follow up from clinics in hospital into the community. They have been fine-tuning and developing this system for 5 years and currently have 1612 patients they are supporting. This has saved many thousands of unnecessary outpatient appointments, while keeping patient safety at its heart."





DAWN ESTABROOK, CLINICAL QUALITY GOVERNANCE

"Dawn exudes enthusiasm and drive, working to tackle violence and aggression towards staff. Dawn is frequently the person to volunteer to take actions and always sees these through with huge attention to detail and commitment. Her openness, honesty and desire to understand the issues from all perspectives makes people want to engage with her. She is an incredible person with huge levels passion to always be the best she can be."

DIABETES & INSULIN SAFETY GROUP

"This initiative was designed to enhance patient safety, improve existing practices, and provide essential support across the Trust. With representation from all care groups and corporate teams, the group has driven a significant transformation since its launch last year. As a direct result we have seen: increased visibility of the Diabetes team, increased awareness of hypoglycaemia, and - most importantly - zero serious incidents."





HELEN BLAMEY, ANAESTHETICS

"Spinal and epidurals are widely used in the obstetric setting. Neurological complications like permanent nerve injury are rare, but early detection is important to prevent harm. One measure of this is that the patient can raise their leg four hours after a spinal or epidural. Helen introduced yellow wristbands, carrying the time of the procedure for patients to wear, making enabling patients to have more agency in making sure the four hour window was observed, and that their care was escalated."

"Rebecca is not only a dedicated healthcare professional but also a true champion of the power of music in fostering well-being, community spirit, and emotional support. As the founder of the choir at the Royal Berkshire Hospital, she has created an invaluable space where staff can come together to enjoy music, relieve stress, and support each other through the challenges of working in a hospital environment."

"Saro has been one of our welcome desk volunteers since 2014 after a career at the Trust that started back in 1973. Helping patients and visitors find their way around the hospital, Saro conducts her volunteering role with upmost helpfulness, kindness and pride. "Sue works as a patient companion and alongside this, often steps forward to help in ad-hoc jobs such a blood-running or helping run a stand in main reception. The patient companion role is so important to Sue, that alongside working herself, she has taken a lead on growing our capacity including; organising workshops, training, and talks, to increase the number of patient companions, and their confidence in doing the role."

SYLVIA CLARKE

"Starting as a Welcomer at Battle Hospital more than 30 years ago, Sylvia is now a 'Chemo Runner' on King Edward Ward in the Cancer Centre. Bringing chemotherapy treatments from pharmacy, Sylvia makes sure the team can focus on treating patients rather than making the trips themselves. Sylvia always has a cheerful manner and brightens the day, and is also our oldest volunteer, celebrating her 90th birthday at the end of May!"





TIM GILL

"Tim is a delight to volunteer with. He's conscientious, has a sense of humour, and is welcoming and mindful of the needs of his passengers on the hospital buggy. Tim started in 2019, temperature checking during Covid, and he is a dedicated Pharmacy runner. He also volunteers for the Royal Berks Charity, marshalling at the half-marathon, welcoming at the Minster carol service and collecting on Reading station at Christmas."

INNOVATION OF THE YEAR



CANCER PREHABILITATION TEAM

"Dedicated to transforming the surgical outcomes of cancer patients through a holistic approach, the team is made up of a physiotherapist, a dietitian, and two health coaches. They provide a personalised programme to optimises a patients' physical, nutritional, and mental well-being before surgery. Proven to increase patients resilience, surgical outcomes, and recovery times, they have set a new standard for preoperative care."

SHARED DECISION MAKING & DEVELOPING A HOLISTIC TOOL FOR HAEMODIALYSIS PATIENTS

"The team set out to create a tool to engage patients in shared decision making and improve their understanding of what was important to haemodialysis patients in terms of their care. This tool and its outcomes are now embedded in patient records, updated at least once a year, and available in six languages. With questions like 'What's important to you in life?" the team also signpost patients to other services to give wrap-around care."





PAPERLESS DIGITAL DELIVERY

"The team has revolutionised medication delivery within the Trust by implementing a fully digital, paperless prescription tracking system. Using mobile devices and barcode scanning technology, they have transformed how medications are delivered to wards - eliminating paperwork, reducing errors, and improving efficiency. Demonstrating that innovation is not just about invention - it's about transformation and impact."

PHAGENYX PROJECT

"Funded by the Royal Berks Charity, we're the first Stroke Unit in the South East to have phagenyx equipment. This is life-changing for many of our patients who have lost the ability to swallow and could otherwise need a permanent feeding tube, or have to live in a care home. Every nurse on ASU has been trained, with the equipment delivering electrical stimulation to the patients swallowing muscles, to get them working independently again."





SINGLE POINT OF ACCESS

"In just six months, the team has revolutionised patient flow, reducing pressure on ED and making sure patients receive the right care in the right place. They have streamlined admissions, prevented unnecessary ED attendances, and improved efficiency across multiple departments. Without this service and Kirstie and Lisa's leadership, I'm sure that the winter pressures experienced in the RBH this year would have been considerably worse. An awesome and innovative service."

OUTSTANDING COMPASSION IN CARE

ANTIA GOMEZ, INTERVENTIONAL RADIOLOGY

"Antia shows kindness, empathy, and professionalism, making sure every patient she encounters feels heard, and well cared for. A great example was when a patient mistakenly arrived on the wrong day for their appointment. Instead of sending them away, Antia took time to reassure them, make them feel at ease, and look at every option to accommodate them, allowing them to get their treatment the same day - showing her commitment to patient-centered care."

"Cydney demonstrates dedication to patient care, always prioritising the safety and well-being of her patients. She is known for her thoughtful and compassionate approach, taking her time with each individual and never rushing them. This is important when working with patients who may need additional support in communication or understanding. Her gentle approach helps them feel heard, creating a safe and supportive environment for them to engage in their care."

"Kindness goes such a long way, especially during the worst times of one's life. Donna made a tremendous difference for our family when our baby was in Neonatal ICU. She always strived to ensure we understood and felt confident with the medical care he received.....She encouraged and supported us throughout. RENAL TEAM

The hospital's neonatal team recently welcomed new state-of-the-art incubators, partfunded by Royal Berks Charity. Rachel Whiteland, Directorate Manager for Paediatrics and Neonates, said: "This investment is a testament to our commitment to delivering outstanding neonatal care.
