King's Birthday Honours: Congratulations to Mark Foulkes MBE

Mark Foulkes, Macmillan Lead Cancer Nurse and Nurse Consultant at the Trust's Berkshire Cancer Centre has been awarded an MBE in the King's Birthday Honours list 2024. The honour is in recognition of his services to nursing, including during the Covid 19 response.

During an impressive 21-year career at the Trust, Mark helped to set up the Royal Berkshire Hospital's Acute Oncology Service in 2015. Through this work, and the roll out of it nationally, any patient with cancer, anywhere in England, is assessed and supported by oncology trained staff. This makes a huge difference to many tens of thousands of people every year, and Mark continues to provide long term advice and support to colleagues across the country working in acute oncology.



Over his long career, Mark also made the Royal Berkshire Hospital one of the first to have 'holistic needs assessments' to listen to and address the needs and concerns of people living with cancer.

He also helped to establish the Cancer Patient Partnership at the hospital, where patients affected by cancer have a voice in the decisions and running of the cancer centre.

Mark is a passionate advocate for UK cancer nurses, which was evidenced during his time as the President of the UK Oncology Nursing Society between 2021 and 2023. He provided leadership to oncology colleagues nationwide through Covid, and his work helped oncology patients to receive their treatment safely during the pandemic. Mark also gave evidence to the Health Select Committee on cancer recovery post-Covid.

A keen advocate of bringing treatment and care 'closer to home' Mark championed and drove through work to get a purpose-built floor set up with four chemotherapy chairs at West Berkshire Community Hospital, and helped design the Bracknell Health Space Chemotherapy Unit.

Mark said, "I'm very pleased, very proud, and very shocked to have been selected for this award. I want to share it and dedicate it to all my fellow cancer nurses across the UK who do amazing work every day, supporting our patients, their families and loved ones, and each other."

Chief Nursing Officer Silver Award presented to Sharon Herring

Sharon Herring, Associate Chief Nurse - Patient Experience, Workforce and Education, has been recognised for her work advocating for patient involvement, community engagement and equalities after receiving a Chief Nursing Officer Silver Award.

Dame Ruth May – Chief Nursing Officer for England – shared the news with Sharon, and was supported by Katie Prichard-Thomas, Chief Nursing Officer at the Trust, who presented Sharon with her award.

The Silver Award is given to nurses who go above and beyond, demonstrate leadership in diversity and inclusion

developing services for patients, and champion diversity and inclusion.

Sharon, who has worked at the Trust for forty years, was nominated for her work to develop our Junior Carers' programme which is now in its sixth year; setting up our MEET PEET initiative to reach out to seldom heard groups within some of our most deprived communities; helping with our Seeking Sanctuary work to support pregnant asylum seekers and refugees; and setting up our Patient Leaders programme to encourage patients to become health-leader volunteers and act as advocates and critical friends in the Trust.

Additionally, she has looked for innovative ways to reduce the number of patients who do not attend (DNA) their appointments, working with them to reduce DNAs by 50 per cent in some specialities.

On receiving the award, Sharon said: "I'm so immensely proud and honoured to receive this award. I owe a big thank you to the Trust for all the support and development invested in me over the years, the inspirational leaders who continually encouraged me, and finally the amazing teams I've worked with."

Andrew Doggart awarded Honorary Membership of The Royal College of Radiologists

Congratulations to Andrew Doggart, Head of Brachytherapy Physics at the Trust, who has recently been awarded an Honorary Membership of The Royal College of Radiologists.

Andrew has lectured Oncology Registrars on fundamental Physics for Radiotherapy over his entire career – both formally and informally - and it is for this, and for recent services to the Examinations Committee of the College as an external examiner in Physics, that he has been awarded Honorary membership.

Andrew has been at the Trust for 21 years and is part of our Radiotherapy Physics Team. He was presented with his Honorary Membership by Dr Katherine Halliday, President of the Royal College of Radiologists at Westminster Central Hall. Well done Andrew!

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

Governor Article - Sally Moore Staff Governor: Admin/Management

I'm writing this on General Election day after 6 weeks of being 'doorstepped' by Parliamentary candidates campaigning for my vote. It struck me that many of us don't see or hear from our politicians from one year to the next unless there is an election looming. It's a shame, as the only way to know what matters to local people is by taking the time to talk – and listen - to them on a regular basis.

That's very much how I've seen my role as a Staff Governor – being the eyes and ears of our staff and feeding their views and ideas back to the Governors who then, in turn, feedback to the Chair of the governors and the Trust's senior leadership team. The Trust prides itself on being a learning organisation and, in my experience, the executive team are always keen to hear the views of staff and, wherever possible, act on them. I'm also one of the Trust's 20 Freedom to Speak Up Ambassadors and, again, I've always found the senior leadership team here to be very receptive and responsive.

From a Staff Governor point of view, it's been interesting to see how active and well informed the governors are and the time and commitment they devote to the role of holding the Trust to account. Their scrutiny of Trust activity ensures transparency and openness which I think is vital to maintaining the delivery of high levels of safe patient care. The wellbeing of staff and volunteers along with the importance of progressing our work in diversity and equality are always at the forefront of governor discussions which I hope reassures staff about the value placed on such vital issues.

I've worked at the Trust for five years now and it's my first experience of the NHS following a long career in journalism and communications and I can honestly say I've never worked anywhere where the staff are as valued as they are here. I work in the communications team and we recently organised the staff CARE awards and the long service awards. Both events highlighted not only the incredible work being done by our staff but also the fact so many of them stay with the Trust for many, many years. I think this level of loyalty and commitment comes from working at an organisation that listens and learns and is always striving to do better – as evidenced by the What Matters staff engagement programme which is currently running.

My time as a Staff Governor ends soon so I'll be passing this baton on to someone else following the recent 2024 elections. It's not a massively time consuming role, and you get lots of expert guidance from the Corporate Governance team and a really interesting insight of behind the scenes of the Trust and there's a feeling of job satisfaction in getting things done and helping to make change happen.


