A special royal visitor

Last month we were honoured to welcome the Prince of Wales to our staff health and wellbeing centre across the road from the Royal Berkshire Hospital.

In his role as Joint Patron of NHS Charities Together, Prince William came to mark the fifth anniversary of the Covid pandemic and to see how funding from NHS Charities Together and Royal Berks Charity is being used to support staff health and wellbeing.

Accompanied by our then Chair, Graham Sims, Prince William toured the staff health and wellbeing centre and gardens to see the gym we provide for our staff members' health and wellbeing. He was interested in the connection in wellbeing and mental health, and spoke

with staff about the difference that our health and wellbeing support makes to them, and what it means to have the centre and gardens as a place to come and decompress.

Later Prince William spoke to members of staff about their work during and since the Covid pandemic, including our Staff Covid Vaccination Programme and setting up our Long Covid service.



We've received top scores in the NHS Staff Survey!

We're proud to announce that we've been ranked as the top acute Trust in England across multiple areas of staff experience in the latest NHS Staff Survey.

The NHS Staff Survey is one of the largest workforce surveys in the world – collecting feedback on staff experience on a variety key metrics including inclusivity, recognition and reward, staff safety, engagement, and morale.

More than 3,700 members of our staff took part in the story and from their feedback, we've received some of its highest ever scores and has been ranked as the top acute Trust in England in 13 areas, including:

- Taking positive action on health and wellbeing.
- Staff being able to make improvements in their area of work.
- Staff feeling their work is valued by the organisation.
- Learning from and preventing errors or near misses.
- Staff feeling that their role makes a difference to patients.

Investing in our staff is one of our key strategic aims and the results of this year's NHS Staff Survey are the culmination of increased investment in staff experience since the Covid-19 pandemic. Over the past several years, we have:

- opened a multi-million pound health and wellbeing centre and gardens for staff
- built upon our reward and recognition offering
- expanded transport options
- provided greater leadership and development training
- provided a variety of new benefits including free health checks, out-of-hours food, in-house psychological support, and a staff GP service

Steve McManus, Chief Executive of Royal Berkshire NHS Foundation Trust, said: "We couldn't be prouder of the results from this year's NHS Staff Survey. Our staff and volunteers are our greatest assets and its fantastic to see that despite a challenging environment we've been able to make real, measurable improvements to staff experience.

"It is brilliant to be ranked as the top acute Trust in England across so many areas, but we know there's always more we can do. This year's results are a fantastic foundation for us to build on and make Royal Berkshire an even more fantastic place to work for."



HIV and Hepatitis testing offered in our ED



More patients in Berkshire will benefit from access to HIV and Hepatitis treatment now that our Emergency Department has started to routinely test adults.

All patients aged 16 or older who receive a blood test at our Emergency Department (ED), will now also be tested for HIV as well as Hepatitis B and C.

We will follow up with any patients who test positive within fourteen days, and refer them

directly to our sexual health service – the Florey Clinic – for information, support and treatment. Patients can opt-out of testing by informing a member of ED staff.

Royal Berkshire Hospital is one of 47 emergency departments in England which is providing opt-out testing for HIV, Hepatitis B and Hepatitis C. Reading is in a high-prevalence area for blood-borne viruses such as HIV. In 2023, the number of HIV diagnoses in England increased 15% from 2,451 to 2,810.

Janet Lippett, Chief Medical Officer for Royal Berkshire NHS Foundation Trust, said: "Huge strides have been made over the last decades for both HIV and Hepatitis treatment, so we're really proud to now be offering routine testing in our Emergency Department. It will make sure less people go undiagnosed, and more patients can access the care and treatment they need."

Molly, is our new pet therapy dog who started visiting our intensive care patients at the beginning of this year.

Her owner started training Molly in 2021 with the <u>Pets As Therapy charity</u>, and as a result she now has all her certificates.

Sarah Lupai, Staff Governor: Nursing & Midwifery

Hello, Salaam and Hola. My name is Sarah and I am a Staff Governor at the Trust representing Nursing and Midwifery.

I was born in Juba, South Sudan and came to England when I was 5 years old. My

heritage is South Sudanese and Ethiopian. I speak Arabic and English, and am also currently learning Spanish.

I have been a registered Adult Nurse coming up 17 years this October. My journey started at Reading's old Battle hospital as a Health Care Assistant prior to attending

the University of West London to complete my Nursing degree. I graduated in 2008 and returned to Neuro Rehab, and although I've since left the team, we still meet up regularly. In a previous role I had the pleasure of working within Gastroenterology leading the Enteral Nutrition service for 8 years.

I'm currently the Ethnically Diverse Patient Experience Liaison Nurse (I know it's a bit of a mouth full) which is by far my most rewarding position. Improving health inequalities is a critical goal for achieving a fair and just healthcare system and something I am very passionate about.

This role works within the Meet PEET team (Patient Experience and Engagement Team) delivering full health checks in community settings to under-represented populations. We aim to help those who are most at risk of serious health issues such as cardiovascular disease and diabetes by identifying ways to reduce their risks and providing advice and guidance so people can start to address other issues impacting their health and wellbeing.

As part of this role, I build rapport with community leaders so we can help support and empower our underrepresented communities with healthcare access and education that is relevant to their ethnicity, gender, culture, age, sexuality and any other characteristics. I work closely with services and departments in the hospital to showcase and promote them.

I also collaborate with local health, voluntary and community sector services to support people's wellbeing, enabling them to live fulfilling lives, make healthy choices and address health inequalities that impact them.

In addition to my main role, I wear a number of other hats at the Trust including being a 'Freedom to Speak Up' ambassador, Royal Berks Charity champion, Ethnic Minority champion as well as being a Staff Governor.

Being a Governor has been really rewarding, not only do we play a vital part in representing the voices of our constituents (in my case Nursing & Midwifery staff group), but as a Council we were instrumental in the recent recruitment of the new Chair of the Trust Oke Eleazu. (See page 2)

Single Point of Access team celebrates first birthday!

Happy birthday to our Single Point of Access team, which recently celebrated its first birthday!

The team was created to work with GPs, ambulance, community hospitals and other referring partners to divert patients straight to one of our other hospital services, rather than using our

Emergency Department (ED) as the gateway to the rest of the Trust.

This helps us to ensure patients are seen in the clinical department most appropriate to them more quickly and help reduce overcrowding in ED.
