



Endoscopic ultrasound aftercare advice

Today you have had an endoscopic ultrasound – an examination of your gullet and /or stomach. You are unlikely to have any serious side effects but please be aware of the following information and advice.

What to expect after your procedure

- Your throat may feel slightly sore for a few hours.
- You may feel drowsy for several hours.
- You may feel a little bloated if some air used in the procedure has been left inside. These
 things will pass and there is no need for any medication.

Please be aware that:

- You must NOT drive for 24 hours.
- You must <u>NOT</u> operate machinery, drink alcohol or sign any legal documents until the next day.
- You may eat and drink normally one hour following the procedure (two hours if you had a fine needle aspiration FNA).

Serious side effects from this procedure are very uncommon: however, if you have any problems with:

- A persistent sore throat
- Worsening chest pain or
- Abdominal pain
- Bleeding
- Fever / shaking / sweating generally feeling very unwell.

<u>Please contact your GP immediately</u>, informing them that you had an endoscopic ultrasound.
