

Endoscopic ultrasound aftercare advice for patients

Today you have had an endoscopic ultrasound – an examination of your gullet and/or stomach. You are unlikely to have any serious side effects however:

- You may feel drowsy for several hours.
- Your throat may feel slightly sore for a few hours`.
- You may also feel a little bloated if some air used in the procedure has been left inside.

These things will pass and there is no need for any medication.

- You must not operate machinery, drink alcohol or sign any legal documents until the next day. You must not drive for 24 hours.
- You may eat and drink normally one hour following the procedure (two hours if you have had a fine needle aspiration - FNA).

Serious side effects from this procedure are very uncommon; however, if you have any problems with:

- A persistent sore throat
- Worsening chest or abdominal pain
- Bleeding
- High temperature / feeling feverish

Please contact your GP immediately, informing them that you have had an endoscopic ultrasound.
