

Advice following your Colposcopy

In order to reduce the risk of infection:

- Use sanitary pads rather than tampons
- A shower is preferable to a bath
- Avoid penetrative sex until discharge stops
- Avoid swimming

After biopsies you may have a discharge for up to a week

Following treatment you may have a discharge for 4-6 weeks. This discharge may be red-brown in colour at first and will change as healing takes place.
