

Advice following a kidney biopsy

- It is essential for your safety that an adult to remain with you for the first 24 hours after your biopsy.
- Ask the person that remains with you to check the dressing for bleeding regularly for the first 24 hours. Telephone the department straight away if there is excessive bleeding.
- Pain relief. You may experience some pain or discomfort once the local anaesthetic has worn off. We recommend you take Paracetamol, following the dosage recommended on the packet. Renal patients are generally advised to avoid anti-inflammatory drugs, e.g. Ibuprofen, Nurofen and Brufen, as this group of drugs can be damaging to remaining kidney function. DO NOT take aspirin or aspirin containing drugs for at least 1 week after the biopsy unless given specific instructions. This minimises the risks of bleeding.
- Please ensure the discharge letter is hand-delivered to your GP as soon as possible. You will be given a copy for your own records.
- If you become unwell with abdominal pain or an unexplained temperature please contact the CAPD Unit during office hours or Victoria Ward at evenings or weekends. (numbers at end of leaflet). You may have an infection that will require antibiotics that your GP will not be able to prescribe.
- It is possible you may pass a small amount of blood in the urine, so it is a good idea to drink plenty to flush the kidneys through. Aim for 2 litres of fluid in 24 hours. If you notice any bright red blood (fresh blood) in your urine, feel any discomfort or become faint after returning home, contact your GP urgently.
- It is not appropriate to travel on public transport for 24 hours.
- You may shower or bath as normal 24 hours after the biopsy. Ensure the dressing is removed before washing. There is no need to replace it.
- We advise you not drive for 3 days
- You can return to work and other normal activities 2-3 days after the biopsy.
- Please ensure before you leave that you have been given an outpatient appointment where you will receive the biopsy results and have a future treatment plan discussed.
